Goya's Ghosts stars Javier Bardem, Natalie Portman, Stellan Skarsgard and is directed by Milos (Amadeus) Forman. This historical drama is set over 15 years which gives a unique background to the paintings created by renowned artist Francisco Goya. The combination of the bizarre reasoning and cruelty of the Spanish Inquisition, the Napoleonic Wars, the French Revolution and the Spanish court of King Carlos IV and his Bourbon family show the turbulent times which influenced his work.

Based on the true story of King George VI, The King's Speech follows the royal monarch's quest to find his voice. Starring Colin Firth as King George, Helena Bonham Carter

as his wife, Elizabeth Duchess of York and future Queen and Geoffrey Rush as Australian speech therapist Lionel Logue.

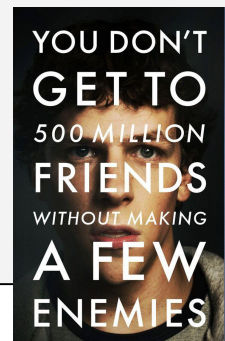
With war looming and the need for calming, articulate speeches to galvanise the nation, Logue is the man who comes to the king's aid.

**11 November 2011: The Social Network**

Directed by David Fincher (Fight Club, Seven) and with smart screenplay by Aaron Sorkin (The West Wing), The Social Network is the story of the foundation of the Facebook website and the ensuing courtroom battles between its billionaire CEO Mark Zuckerberg and his former friends and business partners.

Stars Jesse Eisenberg as Zuckerberg, Andrew Garfield (Spiderman) as best friend Eduardo Saverin and Justin Timberlake as Napster founder Sean Parker, with Oscar-winning music by Atticus Rose and Nine Inch Nails' Trent Reznor.



**16 December 2011: Toy Story 3**

The toy box is re-opened for kids and adults in this third instalment of the Toy Story series, and with Andy grown up and heading off to college, Woody, Buzz and friends are donated to a day-care centre.



Confronted by a bunch of terrifying toddlers they soon find themselves in need of an escape plan.

**13 January 2012: Potiche**

French comedy set in the 1970s Potiche\* stars Catherine Deneuve as the wife of an umbrella company magnate. She shakes off the shackles of her well-to-do existence and takes the reigns of the family business when her husband suffers a heart attack. Gérard Depardieu plays the part of an old flame, now the local mayor. In French with subtitles.
